

Ceramic trophies; consisting of Golden and Ringneck Pheasants, Canadian Geese, Mallard Ducks and Valley Quail, were awarded in each of the classes. They were displayed on a green cloth covered table and received considerable attention and favorable comment from numerous other exhibitors as well as our own Brittany owners and winners.



NATIONAL SPECIALTY

November 26th at 7 p.m. the eighteenth Annual National Brittany Specialty will be under way. Jack Spear from Tipton, Iowa will be hard at work selecting the Brittany that will be the top bench specimen for the ensuing year. His job, as judge will not be an easy one but based on his past experience it will be a popular one. Mr. Spear judged the 1951 National Specialty, and put up Walter Kleeman's Ch. Bucaneer de Kleemanor as Best of Breed, and Robert Buick's Dual Ch. Patsy of Edough was best of opposite. The problem of a National Show of this type where the finest of all Brittanies from all parts of the United States are represented is not new to Mr. Spear. The American Brittany Club in sponsoring the dual features are bound to be troublesome. For those who don't know Jack Spear his success has not only been in his business pursuits, but as a owner, breeder and handler of many a great Irish Setter. Perhaps his most famous was Ch. Tyronne Farm Clancy, 20 times best in show, 35 times best in group, 49 times best of breed. This alone would qualify him for a show ring, but more than his record of show dogs he insists all his dogs be top gun dogs. This has been the requisite of his kennel. When Jack Spear came to Judge the 1951 Show he flew to Carbon dale in his own plane, stayed over for several days to ride and observe the dogs in the field, since then he has been through an attack of polio, but showing his fighting spirit he has come back to again take assignments in the Show ring.

Marcelle Bell, Chairman of the Trophy Committee, has just informed me of the Trophies for the Show. This alone should bring every Brittany out to vie for this outstanding selection.

For the many years I have attended the National I have never seen a lack of entries over all. The Specials have been well represented (except maybe

the West Coast). The Classes that are lacking are the young dogs, Novice, and American bred classes. This is a once a year opportunity to show and see the top Brittanies, to expose your prospect to competition, to attend and take home with you your impression of the results of many years of the efforts of American breeders.

Make arrangements now for your Brittany to be at the National. Let's see all Regionals well represented.

GROOMING YOUR DOG FOR SHOW

There has never been any official way of trimming a Brittany for show. In France they do not trim their dogs at all. The first Britts shown in this country were shown in an untrimmed state. Alan Stuyvesant, who imported most of the early dogs, was against trimming of any sort and believed that the dogs should be shown in their natural state. So it became a custom not to trim.

In this country we show our dogs in the Sporting Group when they win in the Breed. In this group they come up against Setters and other Spaniels that are groomed to the degree. An untrimmed dog, to me, looks unkempt in this type of competition. My thinking on the matter is that this is a beauty contest. We are picking the best looking dog. Would you enter a Miss America contest with your hair hanging at odd lengths down your back, and your everyday work clothes on? You might but you sure wouldn't win any medals for beauty. When one of my dogs was criticized at the National Specialty show by a breeder-judge who should know what he was talking about for having too much hair I decided to do something about it. For the judge had said it was a beautiful dog under all the hair but why hadn't I trimmed it enough so that he, and the ringside could see what was there.

So this is the way I trim my dogs, and the reasons for it. First I take a pair of clippers, and starting at the breastbone remove all the hair on the front of the neck. This can be done with a pair of thinning shears but it takes a good deal more time. Then I turn the clippers over backwards and comb the hair on the sides of the neck working toward the underpart of the neck. This helps to thin the hair on the sides of the neck. Then I take the thinning shears and carefully taper the

hair so that the long hair on the back of the neck gradually blends into the short hair under the neck. This removes the thick ruff that obscures the throatline. It also makes the dog look like he is carrying his head higher. I do this to both field and bench dogs to make them move with a higher head. Then, with a stripping knife I take any scraggly hairs off the ears, both underside and on top. Also if there is a bunch of hair back of the ear it is removed. This helps to delineate the shape of the ear. By careful trimming you can improve the shape of the ear. Sometimes a nice short ear will look long because of a long coat on it. Next I remove the whiskers, either with the scissors or clippers. This makes the muzzle look trim and neat. Never, never, take hair off the top of the ear. This is not a Cocker Spaniel with a lowset ear. This is a Britt and the standard says his ears should be set high. You can even make a heavy coated dog look as tho his ears are higher by removing some hair from the top of the head. But I don't recommend this unless you are an expert and unless it is done well in advance of a show. I also don't recommend, as I have seen some do, stripping hair from the back of the dog. The standard says the coat

may be smooth or wavy but never curly. Perhaps you could remove any straggly ends that stick out on his back but any removal of hair that would make a curly coat into a wavy coat seems to me to constitute faking. And that is against AKC regulations.

Next I comb the feathers on the legs and remove all the snarls. Then, if there are any long hairs that hang out I trim them into a neat feather. I also remove part of the tail feathers if they are exceedingly long but do not trim them close with the clippers like a Cocker. To me that tail feather helps give the dog a merry tail.

The feet come next. I trim the toenails (but not just before ring time as you may cut too close and have a lame dog). Then I remove the excess hair from the bottom of the pads. Too much hair on the underside will spread the feet. Then remove the feather from the pastern down in the front and on the

back of the hocks down. In case that isn't clear, you take off the hair from the last joint down to the foot. This gives the foot a neater appearance and helps the judge see whether he is down at the pasterns. It gives him a neater appearance going away from the judge for that hair on the back legs doesn't brush well and is apt to be short and scraggly. Straggly hair between the toes may be cut off.

All this is done well in advance of the show. Then the day before I bathe the dog with a good dog soap and rinse him with a bluing solution. Brush him well when he is dry and cut off any straggly hair that shows up now and he is ready for the ring, all prettied up for the beauty contest. Last thing before he goes in the ring a good brushing, the final whisker trimming, and maybe a liquid coat groomer for that last minute shine and may the prettiest dog win.

SUSQUEHANNA BRITTANY CLUB

The Bald Eagle Kennel Club of Williamsport, Pa. has just completed its 15th Dog Show and Obedience Trial, with the Brittany entry sponsored for the second time by the Susquehanna Brittany Club. The following is a report of the Brittany participation in that show.

The Bald Eagle Club has now been blessed with something like 9 consecutive years of rainless show weather and, although the sun was blazing at 88 degrees, the humidity was low and there was an invigorating breeze, and these factors combined with the beautiful pastoral setting in the mountainous Loyalsock Valley to produce a perfect day.

Mr. Edgar W. Averill, the well-known Brittany authority of Birmingham, Michigan, held the judge's chair, and his comments and encouragement to each and every handler were well received. We, as one of the younger clubs, were especially pleased to have Mr. Averill comment, many times, that this was one of the best groups of Britts he has seen in 20 states. We know that our younger dogs are doing well in Field Trials, but had not, until now, had any proper yardstick with which to judge the conformation of a representative group of our dogs.

Fourteen Britts were entered, but one male failed to show; this cost us one championship point for the males, but we still had a three point major show for both males and females.

Mr. Carroll Burkhart of Karall Kennels, Sayre, Pa., paid us the compliment of again entering his Ch. Conklin's Royal Terrific, a male special who was with us last year as Best of Breed and has since completed his championship. The situation did not change, and he again swept Best of Breed honors, this time over Prince of Namhoh, a male entered by Dr. Dan Hohman,

the new President of the Maryland Brittany Club, and handled in his first point show by his eleven year old daughter; the young girl did a terrific job, and will have to be reckoned with in the future.

Prince of Namhoh had in turn won over Pacolet's Polly of Faircrest, owned and handled by Alice Smith, as Winner's Dog. Polly garners 3 points as Winner's Bitch and Best of Opposite Sex.

JUDGING ROUTINE

An Explanation of Some Points

During recent months, I have observed that 2 of my requests as a judge to exhibitors in my ring seem frequently to be misunderstood, leading me to the belief that a few words of explanation of what a judge is seeking and trying to accomplish when giving certain directions might prove helpful to less experienced exhibitors who are anxious to present their dogs to the best possible advantage.

The first of these requests is the routine, "Please move your dogs around the ring," with which most judges begin their examination of a class. Have you ever noticed how frequently the amateur exhibitors will do this with themselves firmly on the inside of the circle between the judge and the dog, thus obstructing the former's view of the latter?

Now, the judge's purpose in having the dogs gaited around the ring is to give himself an opportunity to gain his first impression (everyone knows this is important!) of each exhibit's general conformation, balance, style and action. It is extremely difficult to do this accurately when one must keep peering around an exhibitor to observe the dog. Therefore, in the interest of making the first impression the judge receives of your dog a good one, an exhibitor must understand the purpose of this initial trip around the ring and remember that his own position should always be on the outside of the circle, keeping his dog at all times between himself and the judge.

Further along in the judging of a class, the person officiating is quite likely, nowadays, to ask the handler to show the dog's "bite." When he does so, it is not because he is afraid of being bitten that he prefers not to handle the dog's mouth himself. On the contrary, it is from consideration of the dog's welfare and an effort to protect the

animal from the dangers of possible contagion that the judge makes this request.

Many experienced fanciers — judges, breeders and exhibitors—have come to feel strongly that infectious diseases can be and often are spread at dog shows through the practice of judges handling the mouths of many dogs during the course of an assignment. For this reason, increasing numbers of judges are allowing exhibitors to display the "bite" of their own dogs. It is to be hoped that this fairly recent innovation eventually will become still more generally practiced, or perhaps even made mandatory.

Now that the purpose of this request has been explained, let us go a bit further and discuss the manner in which the exhibitor should comply. A "bite" in dog show language is the meeting of the front teeth of the upper and lower jaws. A "bite" can be level (teeth meeting evenly, edge to edge), scissors (the tops of the upper teeth fitting snugly over the tips of the lower), undershot (in which the lower teeth protrude beyond the upper), or overshot (in which the upper teeth protrude beyond the lower.) The standard of each breed has a definite requirement for its bite, depending on head conformation, the work for which the breed was originally intended, etc. In many breeds an incorrect "bite" is a serious fault—in some breeds a disqualification. Thus a judge must check each dog's mouth.

When the judge asks to see your dog's "bite," he wishes you to show him the manner in which the dog's front teeth meet. It is not necessary to open the dog's jaws wide as though for a tonsil examination, except, of course, under special circumstances where color of tongue and roof of mouth (as in Chow Chows) are important characteristics of an individual breed, in which

case the judge then needs to inspect those areas. Under general circumstances, however, the judge merely wishes you to slide the lips apart with your fingers, leaving the jaws closed, so he can tell quickly and easily whether or not the dog's bite is correct for its own breed, soundness and condition of the teeth, etc. Should the judge wish further examination, open the dog's mouth slightly, then slowly close it again.

It is quite simple to display your dog's mouth as described above. Work with him at home, and soon you and he will become entirely accustomed to and proficient in the routine, thus avoiding any struggle or strain when you attempt it during judging. I have heard it said that some judges prefer the older method of themselves handling each dog's mouth because many exhibitors do not show the bite skillfully and judging then is delayed. A poor reason, in my opinion, for perhaps endangering the health of a valued animal! I would suggest to every exhibitor that you make it a habit always to anticipate the judge's wish to inspect your dog's mouth, and that you show it yourself—whether requested to do so or not!

One more point for the novice. If your dog wins second in any of the regular classes at a dog show, there is a chance that the dog which defeated him may go on to take the winner's award, in which case your dog then not only is eligible but **MUST** re-enter the ring to compete against the first prize winners from the other classes for that reserve winner's award. Therefore, should your dog place second in this class, be sure to keep him—and yourself—nearby and available in case you are needed for further judging. Many people do not seem to fully understand this rule and feel, when they have placed second, that their dog is through competing for that day. Please remember that this may not be the case. Much time is lost at dog shows because exhibitors will leave the ring, red ribbon in hand, return the dog to its bench and then wander off to other parts of the show grounds where they can only be found after great delay. A dog which


has been defeated by the dog which later places winners must be called into the ring before the judging of reserve winners.

SKULL medium length, rounded, wedge-shaped; neither coarse nor racy; lateral walls well-rounded not "apple" headed; width less than length; occipital crest only apparent to touch

SKIN fine, fairly loose

WEIGHT 30-40 lbs.

HEIGHT 17½-20½" (only) at withers

TEETH well-jointed; scissors bite neither over nor undershot

EARS set high, above eye level; short, leafy; lying flat, close to head; well-covered with dense short hair; tip slightly rounded

EYES well-set in head, dark colors preferred; eyebrow heavy, expressive, well-chiseled under; eyes so lower lid does not catch seeds, dirt, etc.

NECK medium length, strong, well-set into sloping shoulders; free from throatiness

STOP well-defined, gently sloping

BACK short, straight, slight slope from withers to tail-set; from last rib to upper thigh short (3-4 finger widths)

NOSE brown, tan, or deep pink; nostrils well-open

LIPS tight, dry

LOINS short, strong

MUZZLE medium length, two-thirds length of skull tapering gradually to nostrils; neither broad, heavy nor snipey

TAIL set high; natural or docked; tailless or not over 4"

SHOULDERS sloping, muscular; blade forming 80° with upper arm

HINDQUARTERS broad, strong, muscular; thighs, powerful, muscular; flanks rounded, fairly full, no extreme tuck-up

CHEST deep, neither too wide nor too rounded, reach to elbow

FRONT LEGS perpendicular; bone clean, graceful, not too fine or too heavy

FEET strong, fairly small; toes close, well-arched; not heavily feathered; pads thick

ELBOWS turning neither in nor out

HIND LEGS firm; strong, powerful

STIFLES well-bent

HOCKS firm; turning neither in nor out

PASTERNS only slightly bent

PASTERNS moderately short

COLOR dark orange and white, liver and white. (some ticking desirable not enough for belton patterns); roan patterns or factors of orange, liver permissible (in std. parti-color or piebald)

RIBS well-sprung

COAT dense, flat or wavy; neither curly nor fine; furnishings moderate





and easier to get staunch on point than almost all setters and the majority of pointers. It seems to me that most 15-18 month Brittanies can be shot over without any training at all, if one does not insist on the niceties of steadiness to wing and shot.

... I realize that the average hunter has no use for a puppy he cannot pick up without a horse nor a two year old he has never been able to get on point. It is my fervent hope that Brittany breeders will not overdo their laudable desire to put more run into their dogs to the detriment of their other sterling qualities such as; early pointing, natural staunchness on point, natural retrieving and bird sense.

This is not to be construed as a condemnation of pointers and setters as shooting dogs, for I think that the elite shooting dogs are smart, birdy, properly trained and handled pointers and setters. The point that I wish to make is that the average Brittany is the best pointing dog for the average hunter. I hope Brittany trials point the way to even better dogs for the future."

I do not think any Brittany should be awarded his field championship until he has acquired some bench points.

Further I do not think he should be awarded a Bench championship until he has acquired some field points.

I believe that the field points should be earned. Before a dog should be named a champion, he should have demonstrated his ability and training. He should be steady to wing and shot, and most important to me, he should back or honor his bracemates points.

Since I believe and hope that we are working for a perfect Brittany, I think that these few points are essential. How do my views size up with the rest of the world?





Pointers - Setters - Brittanies

In my recent travels I have exposed myself to many exhibitions or shows of the bench. After a number of such exposures, it was shortly before the point of irreversable nausea that I pulled myself back to consider.

These bench shows must exist because of a basic need, I told myself. There must be a primary purpose for such exhibitions to exist and thrive. So, thinking with a calmness, the realization came that the basic purpose is with the shows—as with the trials—to prove and improve the breeds.



Such a basic need—such a primary purpose, can be understood. One can see too, that a good judge can transpose the gait, the build, the proportion of a dog in the ring, to the dogs ability to function in the field. I can agree that this is good when done in this manner.

The waves of nausea arrive when to me it becomes apparent that appreciation of beauty is stronger than appreciation of function and utility. Realize that I would not be a son of French soil or a son of Pere LeJab, if I did not have appreciation of beauty. But there must be function and utility too.

Example—Can you imagine Mon Pere keeping both eyes on the Venus de Milo when Bridgette Bardot walked by? Mais Non!

So again I maintain that function, ability, utility is of the first importance.

It is therefore frightening, and at the same time an object lesson, to walk to other rings and view some other breeds. I do not know this to be true, and do not offer it as fact, but observation causes me to wonder if some breeds have not lost all idea of their purpose for existing. It appears to me

that the breeders are engaged in a contest to produce the most dysfunctional creatures. One characteristic of a breed is seized upon and magnified until it seems to be out of proportion with the dog and the dogs need of this feature. Some day the ridiculous extreme may be reached—a huge curled tail, a completely flat jaw, or huge round bulbous eyes, and no dog at all!

In the course of this disproportionate magnification it would seem that the basic utility and the dignity of the animal are lost. Pathetic it is to see a guard dog with a nose flat enough to make breathing difficult; a lower jaw jutting to the place where biting or holding is almost impossible. It is equally disconcerting to see another breed that my people used as a rugged retriever degraded by a race for color—all the

good natural points forgotten while the breeders concentrate on an artificially shaped coat, perfumes and jewels.

Again I repeat that LeJab will never have quarrel with a search for beauty, but if one must breed for a greater beauty—let the beauty be in ability, grace and dignity.

There is much talk of the dignity of man.


Let this be my plea for the dignity of the dog.




