## GOOD *Hands*

The link between man's ambitions and his achievements is **hands**. Without them, far from having dominated the rest of the animal kingdom, he could not have survived—he could not hunt, till the soil, fish, or even protect his body from the elements.

Man has, in his hands, the most powerful of weapons when dealing with dogs. These hands can tame, subdue, punish, heal, exact obedience, charm, comfort and cherish. Make no mistake about it—the dog knows this. When man deals with man he looks at the other person's eyes. When dog deals with man, he looks at the person's hands. Although this may be a novel idea, it is easy to prove the truth of it.

Distract a dog's attention from your hands by talking to him, thereby causing him to look up into your face to see where the noise comes from. Then try putting your hands in your pocket while you are talking. You will find the dog's eyes register the move. Try taking a swipe at the next dog you meet, hiding a ball which he wants, throwing this ball without warning at all, or hurling a stone at him. In each case, the dog's reaction is automatic and immediate. He reads the language of our hands correctly every time and either runs, ducks, wags his tail or approaches.

All of which should make us a lot more careful with our hands than we are. First, a few warnings, the most important of which is that no dog should ever be taught to fear those hands. Personally I am always a little suspicious about the kennel life of a dog which draws back from my hands. True, the dog may have no reason for this reaction, but it is more likely that he has been taught to do this by kennel habits which are more thoughtless than cruel. Foremost among these, I would put **grabbing** at dogs. I know it is tempting to grab at a dog that has just changed his mind about coming to you, but it frightens the life out of him and soon builds up a determination to stay out of arm's reach at all costs. Lifting a dog

by the scruff of the neck is an absurd habit and one that I would strictly forbid in a kennel. All puppies loathe it, and usually the only reason they do not turn on the hand that lifts them is because they are too frightened. Cuffing and slapping, and particularly the casual cuff and slap which the dog does not quite deserve, also build up the wrong sort of awareness of the hands. Even the lead can be a weapon in the hands of the unsympathetic.

That is the debit of hands. The credits are just as important, but the purely show side of the dog world does not pay quite as much attention to them as it should. The obedience section knows all about it, of course. Indeed they have become so well versed in the art of hand signals that it takes a very astute judge to spot a dog being given additional instructions by hand. Often the merest flicker of a finger will prevent the dog from making a mistake. The field trial people know all about hands as well. Indeed the dogs are controlled very largely by hand signals when they get well out in front of the guns. Your experienced Labrador man, for instance, can move a dog to the left or right at will despite the fact that the dog may be 200 yards away from him. The sheep-dog man's signals with voice or whistle are very limited in number. Once again, it is the hands that do the work, and they can drop a sheep dog half a mile away on to a penny.

In the show ring, the people who use their hands are few and far between, but how they get results! Look at the terrier handler who at first sight appears to be "topping and tailing" incessantly. In fact, he spends most of the time throwing imaginary bits of grass in front of the dog which makes an enormous difference in its expression; look at the judge who will pretend to toss his judging book to the floor to bring a Collie's ears up! Watch a well-known winner . . . he stands in front of his owner on a loose lead and takes all

# Pedigree Depth

KEY TO THE END OF HD

The most reliable means for elimination of canine hip dysplasia is through "Pedigree Depth" for normal hips. This was expressed by the Fidelco Breeders Foundation. The report is based on work with 38 litters total 236 German Shepherds. Fidelco is a non-profit organization established in Connecticut for the purpose of producing acceptable animals for use as guide dogs for the blind and as special-duty security dogs.

Where both parents are dysplastic, only 7% of the offspring are found satisfactory for training, the report states. With a "Normal" or "Near Normal" dam and a dysplastic sire, 50% of the offspring have satisfactory hips. With a "Normal" or "Near Normal" sire and dysplastic dam, the percentage of satisfactory offspring is about the same. With both parents "Normal" or "Near Normal," 76% of the offspring have hip joints suitable for work. "The greater the number of ancestors that are proven to have sound hips, the higher the probability of normal hips in offspring."

Other conclusions from the Fidelco report:

1. Hip dysplasia is inherited and is only moderately influenced by environmental factors.

his commands from an upraised finger.

A well-known dog trainer can teach a dog to sit in a few minutes without using his voice. Walking with the dog held on a lead with his left hand he stops and immediately passes the index finger of his right hand from the front to a point low over the dog's head. The dog's eyes follow it and lo and behold, as his head goes up, so his backside goes down! . . . This experiment, more than anything else will teach you about hands; will teach you not merely to push, shove and lift a dog into position. And when you have discovered for yourself the magic of the hand, it is up to you to put it to use in the ring.

2. Selection to develop "Pedigree Depth" involving sound parents, grandparents, etc., for normal hips is the most reliable means of decreasing the defect.

3. Increasing the pelvic muscle mass seems to be a major contributing factor in the assurance of joint integrity or normal hips.

4. The slow growing, dry, lean, late maturing pups with good pelvic muscle mass have the best chance for normal hips.

5. A steep croup with less exaggerated hind quarter angulation renders a higher probability of soundness.

Our list of dogs certified as free of hip dysplasia grows daily. However when one considers that the American Brittany Club has nearly 1600 members this list is pathetically short. Have you had your dog x-rayed?

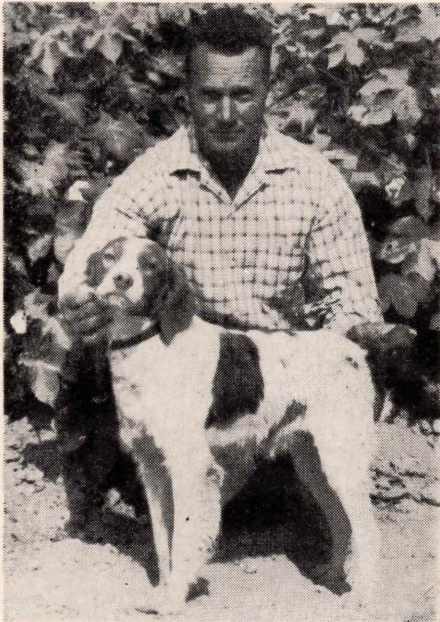

## SPRING TRIAL

The 25th semi-annual trial of the Northern California Brittany Club, Inc., was run at Grizzly Island on March 4 and 5, 1967, two brilliant days, Saturday a bit cooler than Sunday, when it became uncomfortably warm in the afternoon.

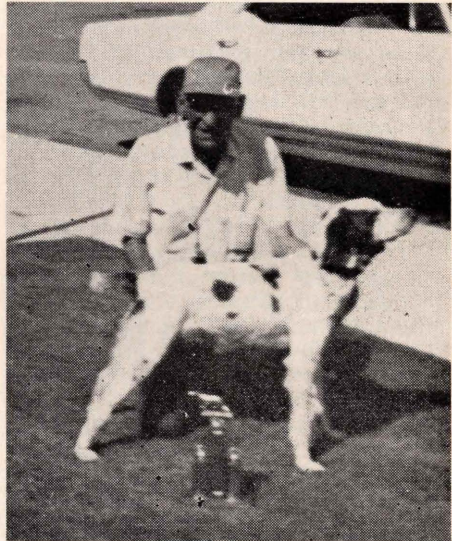


**Fld. Ch. Reno Diablo**

Judges George Hatwig and Ken Raymond were attracted to Topper's Bob White, Kipo Tam's Little Guy, Comeaux's Cajun Duchess, and Long Knife from among the sixteen puppies down, while Clark Allinson and George Szody, two widely-experienced pointer and setter men, brought to the front from the 29 entries in the Open All-Age stake, Reno Diablo, owned and handled by Carl Percell, this win making Reno a field trial champion. Champion Topper's Lucky Bee, CDX, Gerten Fowler's name in both spaces on the entry form, narrowly missed out for the five points toward a dual. Fld. Ch. Kidd Kiki and Dual Ch. Trooper's Little Frenchman, Phillips

and Burkhart handling, finished the placing quartet.

Members of the Northern California Club have finished eleven dual champions, four in the relatively early days of the club's activities, the final seven in the last approximately four years. Of these seven duals still living, six were entered in the Open All-Age on Saturday, and all seven in the Amateur All-Age on Sunday.

Judges Hatwig and Raymond named the first three placing dogs from these duals in the Amateur All-Age on Sunday: Tigar's Jocko, Ultra-Mend Maisie and Trooper's Little Frenchman, who came back on Sunday for his second placement in the trial. Fld. Ch. Gary's Beau Kiki, one of the four field champions running, placed fourth.

In the Open Derby on Sunday, 17 dogs went to the line in front of Judges Allinson and Szody. First placement was withheld, and the Oregon entry, Juchoir's Cover Boy, Dutch Morrell handling, was placed in the second position; Singletree Rena de Angelica, Percell han-

dling, placed third, and the Ewer's Forest Hill Mike took fourth place.

After one follows trials for a few years, his notebook commences to bulge with memos to be incorporated in that "How to . . ." book which everyone is always going to write! We made two entries in our notes over this week-end, indexed under "individual handling."

Our good friend, Joe Thiel, who won a trial a couple of years ago with that find ten seconds before the thirty minutes was up, was really excited when ole Skip threw down on a point in mid-back course. No last-ditch situation this time, he thought. With total assurance, Joe stomped in, produced, fired, sent his dog on, and is still claiming he's heard two stories, one is that it was a low-flying bird and it's pretty bad when judges don't know a bird from a rabbit; the other was a tacit admission that it was a long-eared, four-legged critter, but that his gun went off accidentally.

Our foremost lady-handler coming to the front, prior to putting down, received a full thirty minutes of instruction from the spouse on the "do" and "do-nots" of handling—"all the tricks of the trade," so to speak. Have you ever seen a woman who follows her husband's instructions? She didn't, and this was pointed out to her frequently during the course of the afternoon, up until the first place puppy was announced! After that: silence!

As always, a trial is grossly lacking unless it gets representation from associate clubs, in this instance, from up and down the Pacific Coast, and our thanks to those from the other clubs who could and did participate. And, the club thanks the Field Trial Committee for their efforts to make it a successful trial.

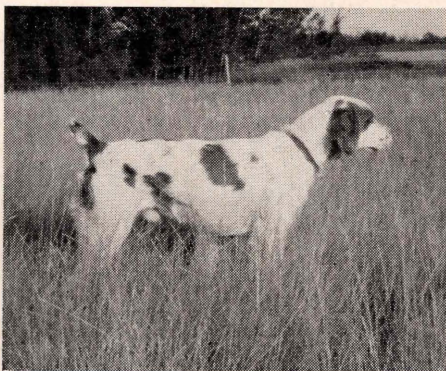

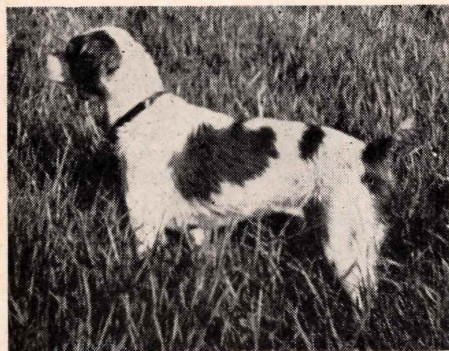

## THE *Expert* MARKSMAN

The scene is the Freeport Bahamas Winchester Public Shooting Center. A shooter slowly swings the muzzle of his 20 gauge back and forth over five small metal boxes arranged in a shallow arc.

"Pull!"

The second box from the left opens and a dark feathered form flies into the sunlight. The shooter fires twice in rapid succession and the bird drops within a marked circle.

This is live pigeon shooting, one of the most difficult of all competitive shooting sports. A perfect 25 x 25 is almost unheard of in world championship tournaments.

The sport originated in Europe almost 100 years ago, and Europeans are still the acknowledged masters of the live pigeon shoot. The Italian shooters are among the best in the world and have won more international contests than representatives from any other country. However, proficiency is now increasing in other countries, notably Mexico, France, Venezuela, Spain, Belgium, Australia, Portugal and the United States, all of which are producing competitors who are proving their mettle in world events.

International live pigeon shooting is basically governed by rules devised by the Federation Internationale de Tir aux Armes Sportives de Chasse (International Federation of Shooting and Hunting Events), with headquarters in Paris and affiliates in most major countries. Specified, for example, are the size of the ring within which the bird must be dropped, shooting methods, the handicap distances from the traps at which the shooters stand when calling for the bird to be released, the number of traps and their placement in the ring.

Specifically:

1. The ring must be 50 meters (164 feet) wide, located on flat ground and enclosed by a fence 31½ inches high;

2. The five traps are placed in an arc facing the shooter and 16 meters (52½ feet) from the rear fence; and
3. The shooter stands on a walk (in line with the center trap), which is marked off in graduated lines to designate the yardage for handicapping purposes.

Most clubs, however, have their own ground rules, reflecting some modifications in the basic regulations. Therefore, individual shooting establishments will probably show variations in the form and dimensions of the ring, the number of traps and the handicapping system.

The design of the traps varies as well. Many consist of a collapsible metal four-sided box with a ball on top. The box is controlled by a wire leading to the house where the referee is stationed. When the shooter calls "Pull!," the wire is yanked, the box collapses, the ball falls to the ground and the pigeon rises in a spectacular zigzag flight at the speed of about 50 feet a second.

Currently, more sophisticated versions of the collapsible box trap are being developed. One that is gaining favor in the United States—and used exclusively at the Freeport Bahamas Club—is electronically controlled. It operates on the "trampoline" principle: the pigeon is placed in a slack canvas sling attached to the inside of a spring-motivated trap and activated by a solenoid release. At the press of a button, located on a console in the traphouse, the bird is thrown into the air, giving him even greater speed in his takeoff.

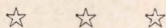
It is the erratic flight of the pigeon that provides the thrill of the sport. The shooter, with only two shells in his gun, does not know from which trap the bird will be released and cannot pre-determine in which direction it will fly. For example, the bird may fly straight forward toward the shooter, but even when it is hit, its momentum (or

the wind) can carry it beyond the confines of the fence, in which case it is counted as a "lost bird."

The Freeport Bahamas Winchester Public Shooting Center has introduced the sport to the Bahamas as a successful adjunct to its trap and skeet ranges. During the first winter season, just past, the Center has been host to many long-time devotees of the sport. In addition, it has introduced live pigeon shooting to innumerable first-timers. Plans are now under way to organize international tournaments on Grand Bahama—a logical reaction to the marked gains in popularity that the sport is winning on this side of the Atlantic.

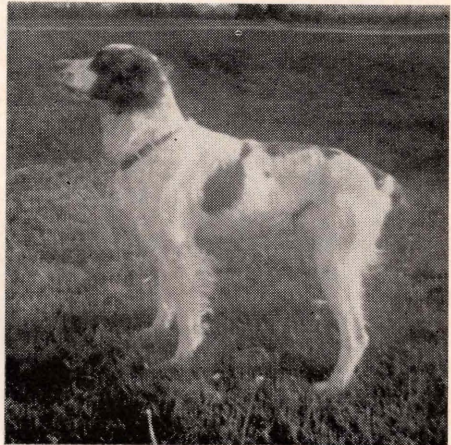

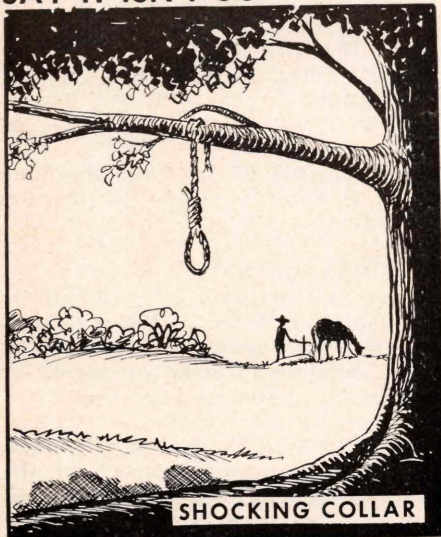

## THE *Pre-Season* DOG

T. W. "Cotton" Pershall, manager of the Nilo Kennels, came up with some points the other day on conditioning bird dogs for early fall shooting:

1. In warm weather, begin conditioning the dog early, and in easy stages. If he's a big, strong dog that wants to sweep the countryside, run him in harness on a long lead. Jog the dog with a horse if possible, or in a slowly-driven car kept off hard-surfaced roads and away from traffic. A dirt road is good if not too dusty; a large circle in a big pasture is better.

2. If the dog is soft and the weather warm, give him 15-minute exercise periods for the first few days, gradually increasing the time as the dog hardens. In hot weather, watch the dog's tongue carefully and do not let it become excessively dark. This can indicate serious overheating.

3. For kennel-tender feet, alum water will help. So will a protective coating of tincture of benzoin, or half-and-half mixture of tannic acid and pine tar. The latter is effective but messy, so dip the dog's feet in sand or dirt to prevent tracking of kennel or car.

In short, don't wait until the week before opening day to start hardening your dog. Start his toughening early, and in easy stages. That isn't a bad policy for the dog's owner, either.

### YOU AND YOUR MAGAZINE

a report from the Editor

We include as many pictures as possible with each trial report. Each club is allotted a 2-page spread. If the write-up is very lengthy and does not lend itself to cutting fewer pictures, or none at all, may be included.

If we could have the results of the entire trial season when we report the first trial we could do a better job of choosing cuts. But we just have to guess who is going to win and try to get all the dogs pictured before the season is over. If anyone can figure out a fair way to do this a solution would be much appreciated. We don't do it 100% right but we do the best we can.

Some Magazine Policies: Cuts made free of charge of all field or bench champions. All Dual Champions will be featured in Show Case free of charge upon completion of this championship. No advertising will be accepted for Hall of Fame nominations. All letters on Hall of Fame candidates will be published but may be edited if too lengthy.

All Specialty shows receive one free cut of the Best of Breed winner.

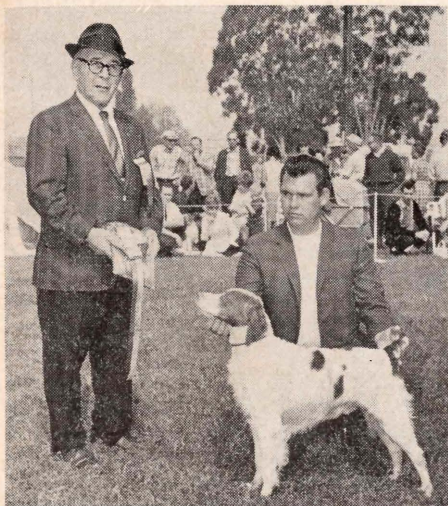

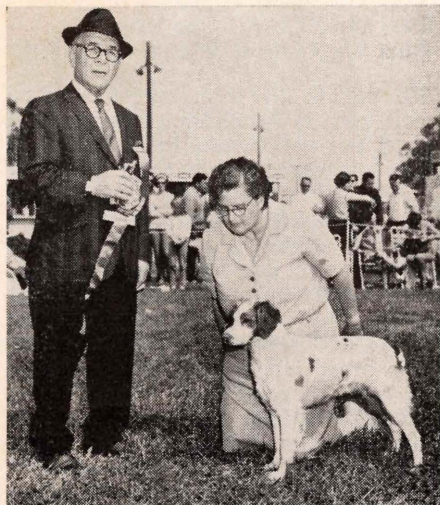

## A *Letter* FROM GRAMMY

Dear Kids:

I hate to tell you "I told you so" but I did. The first show that you brought the dog to I remarked that he was going to be a big one though he was not fully grown then. Later, when he matured I warned you every time I saw you. Remember?

I told you then that you had better go to the Show Superintendent before the advertised hour for showing Brittanies and ask to have your dog measured. It wouldn't have cost you anything but a little effort and the few minutes it would have taken. If you had done this the measurement that the official committee made at that time would have been his official measurement for that show and he could not have been challenged.

With a dog that is as close to the maximum as yours it is quite possible to measure him a little over on a day when he is feeling well, up on his toes, with a winter coat and in extra fat show shape.

You decided to ignore Grammy's advice (the old fussbudget!) So now you find yourself with a dog who has almost completed his championship but is officially disqualified for being oversize.

I know you were convinced that he was one-eighth of an inch under the maximum and that he would prove that way when he was officially measured.

I tried to tell you about measuring committees. Even in the bigger kennel clubs in the large cities it is hard to find a competent measuring committee who is experienced. Most of that type of people are showing dogs in breeds that may be measured and so don't want to be on a measuring committee. When you get to the smaller clubs, like the circuit you went on, the number of competent people to measure is very very small. That circuit is noted for measuring dogs taller than any place else. (Maybe the mountain air raises them up!)

You always take a chance with a largish dog when you don't have him

measured before the judging. I remember the time they measured one of our Dual Champion, group placing dogs from Specials at one of the country's larger shows. They measured him out. That day they had the dog on a thick rubber mat and one leg of the measuring stand on the bare floor. This was enough to put him oversize. Everyone knew the dog was within standard but the owner had to go through the same routine you will have to if you wish to show your dog again.

Now you will have to contact AKC and post a \$25 bond. They will arrange for a place and time for your dog to be officially measured. If the official committee finds him oversize you will forfeit your \$25. If they find him within the standard you will then be allowed to show him again.

If this happens I hope you have learned your lesson. You can be thrown out again at any time unless you have him measured BEFORE the judging commences. Then if he is oversize that throws him out for just that day and

Megs unfortunately got some bait containing Thalamine which had been put out by the exterminators. In spite of all that could be done she died.

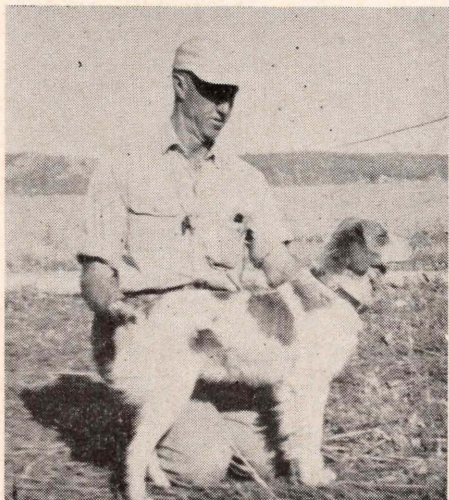
Megs will be remembered by all who have seen her work. She was an excellent working dog and a fine dam.

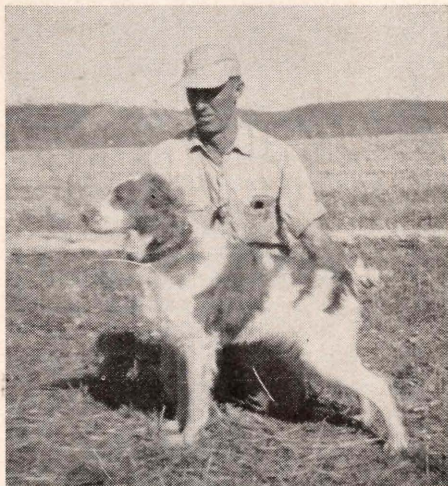
**Bo-nine Ben-Pac Rex**

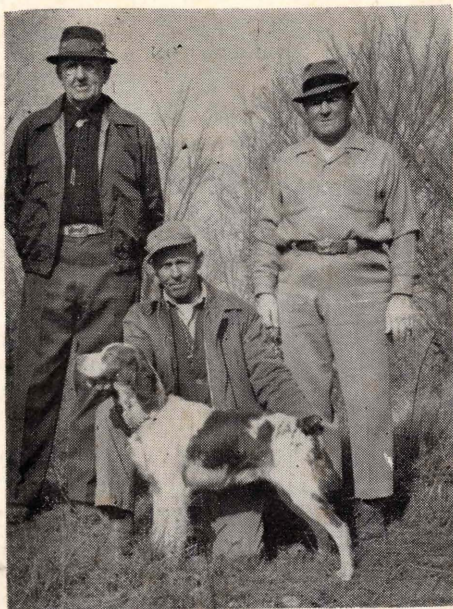

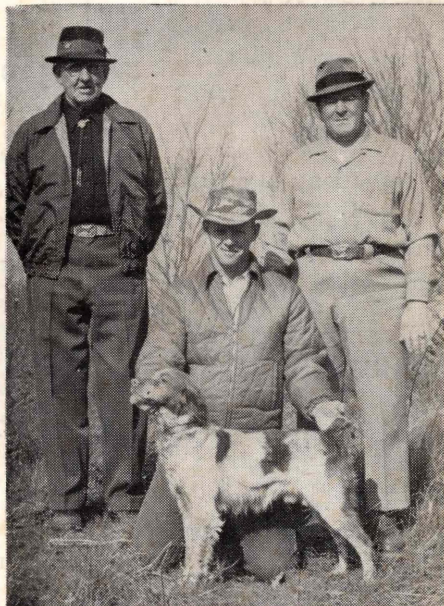
